(Walpole lies not far south of Windsor, across the Connecticut River.) Also, it is likely that one or both of these Vermont editions were the source of the copies sold in Worcester County, Massachusetts, that brought Peter Holmes of West Boylston and Stillman Howe of Holden to grief before the courts of the Commonwealth in 1819 and 1820 for the sale of licentious literature.
